School District Philosophy

The District staff will strengthen its partnership with children, parents, and community to provide an optimum climate for learning in which children may reach their true potential and pursue their life goals.

The Board of Education recognizes that organized education is one of the civilization's greatest accomplishments. It is an instrument by which civilization has advanced and shall continue to advance. It is necessary that we appreciate that man is educable and that society shall advance according to the wisdom and leadership which we are able to provide.

Democratic society is dependent upon education to preserve itself and improve itself. This dependency makes it necessary for the schools to bring about a greater diffusion of knowledge and a deeper understanding of our democratic institutions and processes. This democratic way of life can best be brought about if the elementary schools, as nearly as possible, educate all people to meet their problems as they arise in such a society.

To meet the challenge implied in the above statement, the basic tacks of the District, then, is to educate each individual within the limits of his capacity for behavior changes that will effect continuing satisfactory adjustments to life.
