On behalf of Calumet City School District 155, we would like to welcome you back to the 2018-2019 school year. We look forward to a GREAT school year! Much planning and hard work has gone into preparing for a successful school year.

I would like to provide you with a brief summary of the work that was completed over the last school year. In this time, the District has reworked its math curriculum, adopted new science and music curriculum, and created a new STEM program at the Jr. High School. It is important to acknowledge the hard work and dedication of the teaching staff. The District's teams and committees have worked diligently to make many updates to the curriculum.

Over the 2018-2019 school year, the District will evaluate and make updates to the reading and social science curriculum. I am also eager to share the news of the new Calm Classroom pilot that will be taking place in the Jr. High School and the use of Simply Social Seven at both Wilson Elementary and Wentworth Intermediate schools. Both sets of these Social Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum focus on developing the whole child by creating self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decision making. Research supports that when schools focus on SEL, there is a greater likelihood of an increase in academic performance and a decrease in aggressive and emotional incidents.

I want to acknowledge and thank all of the teachers and support staff who have spent countless hours preparing and creating a great child-centered environment.

I would also like to extend a sincere thank you to our buildings and grounds staff. They worked diligently throughout the summer to make sure our schools are clean and ready for the new year. Many facility updates took place over the summer and are continuing to happen as we speak.

The District is looking forward to the new year and are we are excited for our students to come back to school!

Parents will obtain their child's class assignment. **ALL PARENTS** will be asked to supply proof of residency from each of the following categories:

- 1) current mortgage or lease agreement; contract for house, only if new purchase
- 2) two current utility bills showing date no more than 30 days old; and
- 3) Illinois driver's license or Illinois State ID card with *current address*

Also, an **original birth certificate** is needed for any new student to the district for the first time.

All forms of residency proof must be originals with addresses within district boundaries. Additional proofs of residency may be requested by the Resource Officers, at their discretion.

Parents or Guardians making a fraudulent registration will be charged tuition for the time the child has been enrolled and the child will be dismissed immediately, and possible criminal charges may be filed.

Unless students are registered PRIOR to the first day of class, they WILL NOT be allowed in class on Tuesday, August 21.

Children from all households will be asked to fill out an application for free or reduced lunch. This application is attached and will inform the district if the student is eligible for benefits. HEALTH RECORDS

All students registering for Kindergarten, entering from an out of state school and 6th graders are required to have a NEW physical examination done prior to registration. No appointments will be accepted.

Sixth Grade Physicals

If your child plans to participate in any junior high interscholastic sport activities during the 2018-2019 school year, they will need a new physical exam to be completed before they are allowed to participate.

Dentist

All second and sixth graders are required to have a dental examination done prior to May 14, 2018.

Vision

The law reads: "An eye examination shall, at a minimum, include history, visual acuity, subjective refraction to best visual acuity near and far, internal and external examination, and a glaucoma evaluation, as well as any other tests or observations that in the professional judgment of the doctor are necessary."

The law calls for the eye exam to take place one year prior to kindergarteners starting school in the fall and for all students who are entering for the first time in Illinois. Proof of the eye exam must be submitted by October 15 of each school year.

TRANSPORTATION

Anyone living more than 1.5 miles from their school will be provided bus service. If you live less than 1.5 miles and you have a bus stop close to your home, you may be eligible to purchase bus service for \$200.00 (**paid in advance**) for the entire year, **if there is a seat available.**

Padres obtendrán la asignación de clase de su estudiante. **A todos los padres** se les pedirá que presenten prueba de residencia de cada una de las siguientes categorías:

- 1) Hipoteca actual o acuerdo de arrendamiento; contrato de casa, solamente nueva compra
- 2) dos facturas de servicios públicos actuales que muestre la fecha de no más de 30 días de antigüedad; y

También, un certificado de nacimiento original es necesario para cualquier estudiante nuevo al distrito por primera vez.

Dentista

Todos los de segundo y sexto grado están obligados a realizar un examen dental antes del 14 de mayo del 2018.

Vision

La ley lee: "un examen del ojo incluirá, como mínimo, la historia, la agudeza visual, la refracción subjetiva para mejor agudeza visual cercana y lejana, el examen interno y externo, y una evaluación del glaucoma, así como cualquier otra prueba u observación que en el profesional juicio del médico son necesarios.

La ley requiere que el examen de vista ocurra un año antes de que el estudiante de kinder comience la escuela en el otoño y para todos los estudiantes que ingresan por primera vez en Illinois. Prueba del examen de vista debe ser presentado antes del 15 de octubre de cada año escolar.

TRANSPORTACION

Cualquiera que viva más de 1.5 millas de su escuela se les proveerá servicio de autobús.
